As his disciples Jesus commissions us to share him with those who do not know him. But we have questions about this: Why is evangelism important? Does God want to use ME? What would we say?

Based on a book by Jenni Williams, an Old Testament Tutor, this course affirms texts and tackles the challenge of difficult ones. Her wide-ranging treatment of varied stories about very different women reveal the rich tapestry of interweaving texts about women contained in the Old Testament and the agendas that shaped them.

This book is a prime example of why we need to read more female theologians – Williams explores feminist approaches to the Bible while practising outstanding biblical exegesis so that the text isn't swallowed by an agenda but illuminated by its original context.'

Most of us spend the biggest single proportion of our waking hours at work. But how does that relate to our faith? Is work just a means of earning the money to live so that we can spend the rest of our lives doing the things that we really believe in? Is our workplace just a platform for sharing the gospel? Are some jobs more pleasing to God than others? What does God think of the work that we do?

It turns out the Bible has plenty to say on the topic of work. Based on the study book 'Gospel Centred Work' by Tim Chester this course will help discover how we serve a working God and how Christian belief transforms the central problems we experience with work.

We may not answer all your questions, but hopefully we can provide a framework for thinking more biblically about our work. For Lent this year we are offering five different courses, all hosted at church.
